Dear Mr. Yonan,

Please consider the following input for your 2016-2020 Transportation Program modernization project of Sanders Road from Milwaukee to Willow, slated for construction in 2020.

At present, Sanders Road has four lanes, a 40 MPH speed limit, and 12,700 vehicles per day, resulting in a <u>Bicycle Level of Service</u> (BLOS) of high-D - a somewhat uncomfortable level even for bicyclists who are more traffic tolerant. As seen on <u>labs.strava.com/heatmap</u>, this stretch of Sanders already has some level of bike traffic despite its poor conditions - likely because, while the nearby river trail serves recreational users rather well, destination-based cyclists tend to gravitate toward more direct on-street routes.

From the documentation posted on the Cook County website, we understand this project is scoped to consist of pavement reconstruction. We request that the scope be expanded to *include on-street bike lanes* (preferably buffered, if budget allows) and sidewalks, which will serve a broad range of non-motorized users. We anticipate that Allstate Insurance, which is headquartered on this stretch of road, would welcome the opportunity to provide a safe, comfortable array of options for their employees to commute to work.

We would be glad to discuss these and other project design issues. Thank you for your consideration.
