# BikeSafetyQuiz Mini-Grants

## **Summary**

Is your school teaching students bicycle safety? Are driver education students learning to drive safely near bicyclists? If not, Ride Illinois' **BikeSafetyQuiz** (**BSQ**) **Mini-Grant program** could be the answer! The goal of this program is to increase safety for bicyclists and motorists while reducing crashes.

Since 2018, Ride Illinois has partnered with the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) on our BSQ Mini-Grant program. Funding from IDOT allows Ride Illinois to reimburse **K-12 schools in Illinois \$2 per student** who completes our informative, online quizzes as 20-30 minute assignments.

#### Q: I'm a K-12 teacher. How do I apply for a Mini-Grant?

**A:** Complete the brief application at <u>rideillinois.org/safety/bsqgrants</u>. We'll create a unique copy of the quiz to share with your students and other teachers at your school.

#### Q: What quizzes are available?

**A:** Quizzes are available in English and Spanish. We offer three quizzes to choose from:

- Child Bicyclist: for elementary school students. Younger students may need assistance.
- Adult Bicyclist: for high school P.E. or Health students
- Motorist/Drivers Ed: for high school Driver Education students

#### Q: How does my school get reimbursed?

**A:** After your students have completed the quiz, share details via the brief claim form at rideillinois.org/safety/bsqgrants. We'll mail a check to your school within 30 days.






# **Program Growth & Sample Questions**




### **Sample Questions**

#### **Child Bicyclist Quiz**

#### Which is the correct side of the road to ride your bike?

- **A.** Left side (the other side than cars)
- B. Right side (the same side as cars)
- **C.** Bikes are not allowed on the road. Bikes must ride on sidewalks. *Correct answer: B*



#### **Motorist and Adult Bicyclist Quizzes**

When a motorist passes a bicyclist, what is the minimum legal distance (clearance) to leave between the vehicle and the bike?

- A. AT LEAST 3 feet (from the end of your side mirror)
- **B.** AT LEAST 1 foot (from the end of your side mirror)
- C. AT LEAST 10 feet
- **D.** There is no legal minimum distance defined. Use common sense. *Correct answer: A*
